Submission Procedure

To participate in the Webinar, online registration is mandatory. There is no registration fee. A link to the online session will be provided to the registered participant.

Papers are invited from historians, academicians, social activists, research scholars and policy. Participants are requested to send a full paper by 1 October 2021.

Paper should include title of the paper, the author's name, designation, institutional affiliation, mailing address, contact number and E-mail ID. The abstract should not exceed 250 words with 4-5 Keywords. The length of full paper including tables, diagrams, illustrations, references, etc. should be between 4000 to 6000 words. The paper should be mailed in MS word format in Times New Roman, font size 12, line space 1.5 for English for Hindi Kruti Dev 10 in font size 14, line space 1. Notes and references should be arranged as endnotes in the Harvard style format. Selected papers will be published in a book with ISBN after review.
